Flu Vaccinations-Friday 20th October

All pupils will have received a letter and a form home to let them know that the flu nasal spray vaccinations are taking place in school on **FRIDAY 20th OCTOBER.**

Parents are not required to attend. Each child will be accompanied by their teacher and it is a 'sniff' vaccination – no needles! **The closing date for the return of consent forms was toady.** Please note, the Community Nurse cannot administer the vaccination unless the forms have been returned.

Primary 1- Full School Day

Our Primary 1 pupils will stay for a full school day from **MONDAY 2ND OCTOBER**, they will therefore go home at 2.00 pm.

From Monday 25th October, Primary 1 pupils will stay in school for lunch. Next week only, Primary 1 pupils will go home at **1.15 pm.**

As a reminder, to book a School Dinner for your child you should send the correct money to the class teacher each Monday in a labelled envelope indicating the days your child requires a school meal. See Saw App

Last year, we introduced the See Saw app in Primary 1 & 2 to communicate with parents and share what your child is learning in school.
