## Carpark Reminders

- 1. If you have parked your car in school grounds, please walk to the usual collection point where the teacher will hand your child over to you.
- 2. Once a child is handed over to you we expect you to supervise your child in the school grounds. Please DO NOT let them run!
- 3. All children and adults must walk on the footpaths NOT on the road.
- 4. Please show consideration to other drivers and pedestrians.

As a School we do NOT accept any liability for driving/road accidents which happen in school grounds. It is your responsibility to ensure you drive carefully and observe where there are children and adults.
