How to raise a concern...

At Ashgrove Primary School we value parents and carers as partners in the education of our pupils. The views of parents are significant and we encourage the positive contributions which parents and carers make to the life of our school.

We recognise that from time to time, a parent or carer may have a concern about some aspect of their child's life at school. By working in partnership with home, it is our aim that any concern is dealt with quickly and efficiently.

Please find below the procedure we have in place.

AS A SCHOOL WE WILL DEAL WITH ANY CONCERN IN COURTEOUS AND PROFESSIONAL MANNER AS THE NEEDS OF OUR PUPILS ARE PARAMOUNT.

HOW DO I RAISE A CONCERN?

1. Make an appointment with the class teacher to discuss the matter. We strongly advocate making an appointment as otherwise this impinges on teaching and preparation time.

(Making an appointment will enable the teacher to give you the necessary time to listen attentively to your concern. Unfortunately, teachers are not able to ring parents during teaching time).

Most often concerns can be resolved at this stage.

- 2. If after speaking to the teacher the matter is not resolved the issue can be taken up with the Head of Key Stage (Miss Morrison/Mrs Torrie) or the Vice Principal, Mrs Flaherty.
- 3. Following the second stage, you may make an appoint with the VP, Mrs Flaherty.
- 4. If concerns still remain the issue can be referred to the Principal, Mr Smith.
- 5. Ultimately, if the issue is still not resolved the parents/carers can write to the Chairperson of the Complaints Committee of Board of Governors (Mr B. Edwards)-please refer to our Complaints Procedure.

It is very rare for concerns not to be resolved before stage 4.

A staged approach ensures your concerns are heard and considered by more than one person.

Administration of Medication in School

If a child must take medication in school their parent or guardian must complete a school **Administration of Medication form**. For safety reasons, children should NOT bring their own medication to school — this should be brought by an adult and left in the office.

Please remember, if your child requires an inhaler (or any other type of medication) it is your responsibility to ensure there is an adequate supply in school and that it is in date.





Standardised Testing Week

During the next two weeks we will be conducting standardised testing in school for all pupils from Primary 4-7. The tests are computerised assessments and will be conducted in the ICT Suite. This information will give teachers a clear baseline of where all individual pupils are in terms of their academic progress. We will then use this information to inform planning and teaching approaches.
